



## Sisterhood Relationship between

## Sydney College of Divinity and Kosin University

Kosin University and Sydney College of Divinity, hereby agree to exchange a mutual agreement to work with each other in order to strengthen the ties between the schools, to deepen our understanding, to help train talented individuals, and to encourage a Christian life-style especially for young people.

1. The two schools will cooperate in the following areas:

- A. Establish cooperation for educational development and help train talented individuals
- B. Increase students' creativity and the usage of human resources for learning activities and research support
- C. Usage of each other's facilities and joint international volunteer cooperation program development and support
- D. Supporting career guidance and college counselling through professionals in the field
- E. Special lectures by professionals and educational support for character building and learning enhancement
- F. Co-participation in holistic education, cultural activities exchange, and other events



G. Mutual benchmarking of a curriculum based on a Christian worldview

H. Exchange of information about each school's marketing, sponsors, and collaborative activities

I. Other appropriate matters

2. Terms and conditions needed to enforce this agreement will be decided through consultation between the two schools, subject to their respective regulations and resources.

3. This agreement will be effective for 5 years from the signed date and, if neither school objects, the agreement term will be automatically extended.
